RESOLUTION

Of the participants of the III International Seminar "The raw material base for the malting and brewing industries" 25-26 October 2011 Moscow

To Victor Zubkoy.

First Deputy Prime Minister

Dear Mr. Zubkov!

Barley and Malt Union (BMU) is an organization that brings together the primary links of the production chain "malting barley - beer": plant breeders, seed growers, agricultural producers, producers of hops and malt.

At the moment Russia annually produces up to 2.5 million tonnes of malting barley (sown area of about 1 million hectares) and about 300 companies are engaged in its production, and most of them are members of our Union. Due to the support of Elena Skrynnik, Minister of Agriculture and Gennady Gorbunov, the President of the Federation Council Committee on Agro-Food Policy and Fishery, our Union has established a clear system of interaction with a large malting and brewing business. Eventually on 28.09.2011 in the Ministry of Agriculture of the Russian Federation was held a signing ceremony of a Cooperation Agreement between Barley and Malt Union and the Union of Russian producers of beer and soft drinks.

With the support of the above mentioned government agencies we have been able to resolve all pre-existing problems in the relationship between the producers of malting barley and its consumers. In the framework of cooperation of two Unions there appeared a new possible activity: the revival of domestic hops production which, if successfully implemented, will give a job to more than a thousand farms, who will produce 30 thousand tons of hops annually, including for export purposes.

However, there are some very important issues that have a direct impact on companies - members of our Union. These issues include legislative proposals for regulation of the beer production that considerably destabilize agricultural producers. Attempts to regulate the market of brewing products without their consent can virtually lead to the complete elimination of the production of malting barley and as a result to depriving our agribusiness of up to 50 billion of income annually.

As you know Mr. Zubkov, on 18.11.2010 was signed the Agreement "On the common principles and rules of technical regulation in the Republic of Belarus, Kazakhstan and the Russian

Federation". On the base of this agreement was prepared a draft of Technical Regulations of the Customs Union "On the safety of alcohol products" (further the Technical Regulations). These Regulations aim to establish some uniform mandatory requirements for alcoholic beverages and to ensure its free move within the Customs Union. The present draft of Technical Regulations stipulates norms that, in case of their entry into force, will lead to extremely negative consequences for the entire production chain "malting barley - beer." Here I would like to mention first of all the definition of beer used in the document. The Draft Technical Regulations restrict the use of grain products and (or) sugary products at 20% of the malt used.

Unfortunately, the domestic malting barley, depending on weather conditions may be of little or no use for malting processes and can be used in the brewing process just as unmalted source of grain. In this regard, the Russian manufacturers of malt and beer, for obvious reasons, will not be able to meet their needs in Russia and will buy raw materials for beer production abroad, as it was 10 years ago. Today the Russian agribusiness companies provide 80% of the needs of the Russian brewing industry for raw materials.

It is also important to note that limiting the use of cereals and sugar-containing products contradicts to international practice of brewing and the requirements of EU and the EEC countries. It is also not justified in terms of safety and quality. For example, the USSR State Standards established proportions of malt and grain products and (or) sugar-containing products as 50% to 50%.

Federal Service for Alcohol Market Regulation proves the need to impose restrictions on the use of unmalted materials in the beer production by the standards of the regulation EC General standard for food additives CAC/STAN 192-1995, Rev.6 (2005) Codex stan 192-1995 (Rev.6-2005). However, we ask you to draw your attention to the fact that in this document there are no restrictions on the replacement of malt by grain products or grain, and the definition of beer and malt beverages includes a wide range of varieties.

We are also bewildered by the definition of the standard prohibiting the production and trafficking of beer in a plastic bottle (retail pack based on polyethylene, polystyrene and other plastics material). The Commission of the Customs Union took a decision number 769 from 16.08.2011 to adopt a Technical Regulation "On the safety of the package", according to which there are no restrictions on the use of plastic packaging. It should be noted that the use of PET – packaging, including reusable one, is quite common in Germany, Scandinavia, Asia and Latin America. The ban on beer in PET bottles will strike a lot the entire production chain, as today about 47 % of the beer is produced in this package.

Based on the above, Mr. Zubkov, we ask you to help us to make sure that our proposals were included in the final discussion and adoption of the draft Technical Regulation "On the safety of

alcohol products," as well as in establishing an effective dialogue with the Federal Service for Alcohol Market Regulation by creating an Expert Council composed of representatives of trade unions and market experts, as it is organized in the Ministry of Agriculture.

In addition, we ask you to provide the possibility of organizing your meeting with representatives of relevant unions, market experts and leaders of the largest malting, brewing and agricultural companies to discuss problems and ways to further develop the industry.
